

Revisions to Title 132 – *Integrated Solid Waste Management Regulations* have been proposed to implement Executive Order No. 17-04 on Regulatory Reform, streamline and clarify existing provisions, and adopt changes to state and federal law. Regulatory streamlining and language modernization revisions have been proposed for all chapters. Proposed revisions to Chapter 1 include moving the definition of "major modification" from a fee-related section in Chapter 9, 002 to Chapter 1 which contains all other regulatory definitions. Proposed revisions to Chapter 4 repeal duplicative state coal ash regulations and replace them with new federal requirements for the management of coal combustion residuals (CCR). Proposed revisions to Chapter 6 relocate and condense requirements for the management of paunch manure currently located in Title 126 – *Rules and Regulations Pertaining to Management of Waste*. Provisions related to financial assurance requirements in Chapter 8 that repeat federal regulations verbatim have been proposed for incorporation by reference, which better identifies state differences and reduces text. The various fee-related Chapters in 9 through 11 have been consolidated to a single Chapter 9. Chapters 15 and 16 have been proposed for repeal as they repeat state statute verbatim. Chapter 17 has been proposed for repeal as its enabling statute, "The Plastic Container Coding Act", was repealed on July 1, 2019 by the 106th Legislature. Chapter 18 has been proposed for repeal as it repeats state statutes or general legal principles which do not also need to be codified in regulation. Lastly, Appendices I –III have been proposed for repeal and incorporation by reference from the federal code in those provisions of Chapters 3 and 7 that reference these tables in 40 CFR 258.40.
